

Different types of questions:

1. **Comparison, analysis & reflection** .... "so what did you end up doing?"
2. **Drawing conclusions** "did you have anything different"
3. **Echo** .... Restate what student said ... "S: draw a vertical line T: oh so you're doing a vertical line"
4. **Rhetorical** ... "are the two sides equal? Yes"
5. **Inter-rhetorical/attention keeping** ... everyone can answer just to keep their attention "what is the value for the left hand side"
6. **Further explanation** ... "what do you mean by anything"
7. **Bonding questions** ... building a relationship "very very happy?"
8. **Procedural** ... "have you done all of them... have you?"
9. **Leading questions** (not available to court situations) ... "so you're saying it's a ..."
10. **Short answer** questions ... yes or no ... "what is the result..." single word answer
11. **Conceptual understanding/assessment** ... " $x = 2$  ... what does that mean?"
12. **Wait-time-absent-rhetorical** .... Next line from 11 was the teacher telling what it means. (*Cultural?*)
13. **Scaffolding/Evaluation** ... "T: simplify the expanded form ... S:  $2x-12$  T: do you think this is an identity or equation...."
